# A Message from Our Pastor



#### Devotion – Colossians 3:12-17

<sup>12</sup> Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. <sup>13</sup> Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. <sup>14</sup> And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

<sup>15</sup> Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. <sup>16</sup> Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. <sup>17</sup> And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

It's become a tradition in our family to visit a local orchard every fall. As the summer draws to a close, we look forward to hayrides, picking apples, running through the corn maze, finding the perfect pumpkin, and convincing the kids that, no, the farm cats can't come home with us.

This year my daughter and I were wandering through the pumpkin patch. There was a fair amount of growth, so I was pushing my way through and clearing a path for her to follow me. I kept hearing frustrated grunts. I turned, a little frustrated myself, trying to see what was bothering her. She was trying to follow me while shielding herself with her hands. As I had been pushing the plants away from me, they had been whipping back and hitting her—and they were just the right height to smack her in the face. I was trying to make it easier for her to get through the patch. I wasn't paying attention to what she really needed. Instead, I was only making things harder for her.

We start with good intentions. God wants us to show love by helping others, and by God, we want to do it. But so often our good intentions end in bad results or hurt feelings because we don't take the time to find out what someone really needed.

That's why Paul's encouragement from the Colossians is so helpful in those cases when we've hurt others—or been hurt unintentionally. *Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.* Do I have some grievance against someone? The Lord leads me to forgive that trespass as he's forgiven me in Jesus—especially if that person's good intentions just went awry. Does someone have a grievance against me? The Lord leads me to repent and seek their forgiveness as we seek it—and find it!—from the Lord.

As we do all this, we clothe ourselves in the love of Christ. His love binds us together in perfect unity. We'll have ample opportunity to recall this and put it into practice as we look forward once more to the story of our heavenly Father's eternal, boundless love and the Son he sent.
